A passage to unpack Micah 6 v 1-8

Find the book of Micah in the Old Testament, find Chapter 6 and read verses 1-8.



When Jesus died on the cross he took the punishment once and for all, so that all our sins can be forgiven by God.

Take a moment and ask God if there are any sins in your life that you need to repent of (say sorry) and ask God for his forgiveness. Write them on the corner of the page – pray and say sorry to God, then rip off the corner and throw it away.

The book of Micah is a prophetic book from the Old Testament. Micah was a prophet during a time when God's people were being dishonest and worshipping false gods. God spoke to Micah and gave him a message to share with His people.

In verse 8 Micah shares the sort of life that God calls us to live. Can you think of a practical way that you can apply each of these to your own life?





Jesus said that his disciples would have the same authority and power on the earth as he had done.







The Wild Birds

Verse 11 tells us to put on the full armour of God, each of the pieces of the armour are important. Give some time to thinking about what each part means. Do you give time each day to get yourself ready to live for God?


What are some of the battles and challenges you are facing this week?

Philippians was a letter written to the Christians living in Philippi. Throughout the letter Paul encourages the readers to live iov filled lives for God. It must have been difficult and scary to be part of the early church, in a time when Christians were being attacked for their beliefs.

A passage to unpack 1 Timothy 4 v 11-16

Find the book of 1 Timothy in the New Testament, find Chapter 4 and read verses 11-16.

In verse 12 we learn that some people were treating Timothy as less important because he was young, but we know that God can use anybody no matter their age or experience.

In verse 14 Timothy was encouraged to use the talent he had in being able to prophecy.

Write or draw some of the talents that God has given you, here:

1 Timothy is one of the epistles from the New Testament, which means it was originally a letter. This letter was written to a young church leader called Timothy with advice on how to lead his church.

Timothy was mentored by many people, the writer of the letter who was probably Paul and his mother (Eunice) and grandmother (Lois). They helped Timothy to grow in his faith and leadership abilities.

Draw a picture of somebody who is a mentor in your own faith journey. As you draw, why not say thank you to God for putting them into your life.



Verse 12 encourages Timothy to be an example for others, can you think of a way you could be an example for others in each of these areas?
