EXPLORING THE BIBLE

The Bible might look like a single book, but it is actually a library made up of 66 different books! 39 Book in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament.

The Old Testament books were all written before Jesus came to the earth as a baby (BC) and the New Testament books were all written afterwards (AD)

The books in the Bible are not in the order they were written; they are grouped by **type** of book.

THE OLD

The first five books are known as the Pentateuch or Law books – these tell the story from Creation through to Moses leading God's people out of slavery and into the promised land

The rest of the Old
Testament includes History
books, Poetry books,
sometimes known as
Wisdom books and large
and small books written by
prophets – these are
known as the Major and
Minor prophets.

THE NEW

The first four books of the New Testament are known as the **Gospels** – they tell the Good News about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Acts tells the History of the Early Church.

Most of the New Testament is made up of Epistles (letters) written to the some of the first Christians. The Bible ends with Revelation a prophetic book about Jesus' return.

To make the Bible easier to share with others, each book is divided into big sections called <u>CHAPTERS</u>, each chapter is also divided into small chunks called VERSES.


At the beginning of the Bible is a <u>CONTENTS</u> page – it lists all the books of the Bible and tells you which page each one starts on.

See if you can find this verse in your Bible:

Find the book of John CLUE: It is in the New Testament Find Chapter 3 — look for the Big Number 3 on the page .
