Jesus in the Temple


Luke 2 v 41-52

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Jesus' first followers


Luke 5 v 1-11

Pray for your friends or family members who don't yet know Jesus as their friend.




In the story Jesus told the fishermen to follow him. They left everything behind and went after Jesus.

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Jesus heals and forgives.

Luke 5 v 17-26



In the story a group of friends brought a man to Jesus to be healed. They had to carry him onto the roof, break a hole in it and then lower the man through! We are not alone in our journey to draw close to God; church, friends and family can all play a part in helping our faith grow. Draw or write the names of some of the people who help you to draw closer to God.



Find the story in your own Bible. The book of Luke is in the New Testament, find the big number 5 and the small number 17.

Jesus amazed those watching when he healed the man, but they were even more amazed when Jesus said he had authority to forgive sins. Why not take a moment to pray and ask God if there are any areas in your life where you need to say sorry for your behaviour and seek forgiveness?

Who do you know at the moment who is sick and needs healing? Perhaps you know somebody who like the man in the story has been sick for a long time.

Take some time to pray for them today.



In the story the man's friends knew that Jesus could help their friend. There were obstacles in their way but they did not give up, they kept going till they had brought their friend to Jesus.

Is there an area in your life where you need to keep going in spite of obstacles today?



There is always more for us to learn and discover about God but we do not have to do this alone.

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Jesus calms a storm.

Luke 5 v 1-11



Many of the disciples were experienced fishermen but this storm terrified them. In the middle of their panic they knew that Jesus was with them, but it was like they had forgotten who Jesus was!

Take a moment to think about your first reaction when something goes wrong or you face a difficult or scary situation. What can we do to help ourselves remember that Jesus

is with us?

Luke 10 v 38-42




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Jesus and the children

We all make mistakes and behave in ways that ae not pleasing to God. The Bible promises that we can come to God, repent (say sorry) and receive forgiveness.


Say a sorry prayer today for any behaviour that has not pleased God.

Jesus showed love to Zacchaeus even when he was still a sinner.








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Jesus comes to Jerusalem as King

Luke 22 v 7. 14-21






The bread represents Jesus' body which was broken on the cross.

Bread is mentioned many times in the Bible. In **John 6 v** 35 Jesus said "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry. And whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." Just like God gave the Israelites bread to feed them in the wilderness, we can trust that God will give us the things we need each day. Just like Jesus, we can pray "give us this day our daily bread" and ask God to give us all the things we need.

The wine represents the blood of Jesus.

In the Old Testament animals had to be sacrificed as a blood offering to God, the blood of the sacrifices showed God they repented of their sins. In **Exodus 12** we read about the first Passover. The Israelites painted their doorways with blood from young lambs or goats, God protected them from the plague of death he had sent against their enemies. When Jesus died on the cross, he was the ultimate sacrificial lamb for all of us, his blood was shed so that all our sins could be forgiven.



Pray and ask God to show you if there is anything you need to say sorry for or unforgiveness in your heart.



Communion is our way of remembering what Jesus did, suffering and dying on the cross to take the punishment for all of our sins, shedding his blood as a sacrifice for us all.



Imagine being the disciples hearing this for the first time, how do you think it made them feel? Sometimes we can get into habits or patterns of how we do something. When we take communion, it is not supposed to be a tradition or habit it is an opportunity to really think about God's love for us. Ask God to help you discover something new the next time you share communion.





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
Jesus dies

Jesus is alive again

Luke 24 v 1-6



When Jesus was on the cross the temple curtain was ripped in two. The curtain was stopped people from entering a special place called the Holy of holies where God's presence was, now everybody was invited to draw close to God.

We draw Closer to God?

When we hear the story of Easter we can choose to respond. God invites us to be his friend and be forgiven for all our past mistakes.

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When we know God's love and the story of Jesus it changes the way we live, we can choose to live for God and to share his love with others.
